

Lavender – An Emotional/Spiritual Aura Color

- Imaginative, creative genius, intuitive, sensitive, live in a fantasy world, love to daydream
- Tend to be childlike, naïve, absent-minded, and innocent
- Born aware of other dimensions and realities; they don't live with or as us in this world
- Conduct their day-to-day lives with seeming detachment, disinterest, and otherworldliness
- Need lots of time alone to fantasize and daydream; often feel isolated and misunderstood
- Able to take people to other worlds of make believe with their innovative, creative genius
- When unhealthy and uncentered, Lavenders can have difficulty functioning in the real world. They can be irresponsible, lazy, forgetful, spacey; may not even hold a job or pay bills on time
- When supported and encouraged to express their inner realities they can inspire minds and lives
- Gentle and free-spirits who are not concerned with societal rules or protocol
- Relationships can be difficult; they live in their own little world so much of the time and they are poor at follow-through on commitments; can be perceived as inconsiderate and uncaring
- Partners must be patient and loving to maintain a relationship with Lavenders; Lavenders have a fear of disappointing loved ones and for this reason most are content to be loners
- Often have trouble in school because they tend to daydream so easily and not pay attention
- Some have aptitudes for math and science while others have aptitudes for reading and writing
- They are the most creative, and often the oddest, of all the aura colors
- Most don't manage money well since they don't focus any of their time or energy on it
- **Famous Examples:** Lewis Carroll (*Alice in Wonderland*) and C.S. Lewis (*The Chronicles of Narnia*) are both Lavender/Violets. Dr. Seuss (Theodor Seuss Geisel), who wrote *Green Eggs and Ham* and *The Cat in the Hat*, was probably also a Lavender or had Lavender as one of his primary aura colors.

The **Life Purpose** of someone with the primary color of Lavender is to do what they do naturally – explore other dimensions and realities and then share their amazing otherworldly perceptions with the rest of us. They are here to stimulate our imaginations, inspire our sense of wonder, and awe us with their magical, fanciful minds.

The **Basic Fear** of someone with the primary color of Lavender is being prevented from following their imaginative ponderings.

Lavenders do their best work in relaxed, low-key, unstructured, and quiet environments that allow them plenty of time to daydream and fantasize. Lavenders are simple, creative people. Any job that makes demands of them, pressures them, or requires too much focus and concentration will cause them to wilt, wither and shrivel. A Lavender's world is an imaginary one filled with angels, elves, fairies and other mythological creatures. Lavenders love working with young children because they themselves are rather naïve and childlike. It is no wonder then that Lavenders love telling and writing stories for children. Lavenders are usually shy but friendly people so any job that allows them the freedom to express their unique creativity in a safe, comfortable environment is perfect for them. Lavenders are often drawn to work in the fields of performing and fine arts as well as similar creative fields because of their penchant for imaginative and innovative ideas. Since most Lavenders are too sensitive and shy to perform in front of large audiences they often look for jobs behind the scenes as costume and set designers or makeup artists. Lavenders are spiritual people and do well as therapists as long as their therapy can be creative and experimental. Clinical settings and procedures are too rigid and stifling to the liberal, laissez-faire style of Lavenders. Typical Lavender occupations include the following:
