Magenta – A Physical Aura Color

- Nonconformist, bizarre, eccentric, unique, flamboyant, zany, weird, and outlandish
- Love to shock people with their unusual and outrageous behavior
- Follow the beat of their own drummer; don't conform to societal protocol
- It was a Magenta (Rosalind Russell) who coined the phrase, "Life is a banquet and most poor suckers are starving to death."
- Unpredictable, energetic and spontaneous
- Admirers and collectors of the avant-garde and eclectic in art
- Like being around people but tend to be loners because others are embarrassed by them
- Like being the center of attention yet prefer working alone to teamwork
- Attracted to cutting-edge industries and companies for work
- Usually live in urban areas where they can express themselves freely and get attention
- Love to learn but tend to have a short attention span; often don't finish what they start
- Innovative, creative and artistic (in a unique and bizarre way)
- Free-spirited, freedom-loving, adventurous, love to travel
- Centered Magentas are self-accepting, self-appreciating, happy and optimistic
- Uncentered Magentas feel misunderstood, different, alienated and alone in the world
- In relationships they want fun not commitment; prefer emotional intensity to familiarity
- Tend to change partners often; don't want the responsibility of raising a family
- School is difficult for Magentas because of the structured and orderly protocol
- Magentas are rebellious but not out of anger (usually); they just don't like structure
- Money serves the purpose of giving Magentas freedom to travel, try new things and buy outrageous stuff
- Magenta is a fairly rare aura color
- Famous Examples: Andy Warhol, Salvador Dali, Auntie Mame in the movie *Auntie Mame*, Kramer in the TV show *Seinfeld*, "Doc" Brown in the movie *Back to the Future*.

The **Life Purpose** of someone with the primary color of Magenta is to do what they do naturally – experiment and explore new modes of living and being outside of social protocol. They are here to question everything, especially society's social standards and limitations.

The **Basic Fear** of someone with the primary color of Magenta is the fear of being perceived as normal and ordinary despite considerable effort and aspiration to be different and outrageous.
